RESEARCH INTERESTS

I hold a Ph.D. in Clinical Psychology with concentrations in child and adolescent psychology, and child health and pediatric psychology, as well as a graduate certificate in advanced research methods. My specific research training and expertise are in preventive health, pediatric obesity, adolescent health behavior, and secondary data analysis. Additionally, my clinical experiences with underserved families in both hospital and community settings have contributed to the importance of context and disparities to my research platform. As a result, I established and currently direct the Child Health Equity Research Lab at Tufts University which is dedicated to improving children's health, reducing adult chronic disease risk, and reducing health disparities by engaging in research focused on (1) improving the playing field in children's health through empowering parents and children to engage in healthful behaviors; (2) encouraging adolescents to be masters of their health through interventions, programming, and outreach to reduce health risk behaviors and facilitate preventive health behaviors; and (3) supporting community health through community based participatory research, community-driven programming, and community outreach and advocacy.
